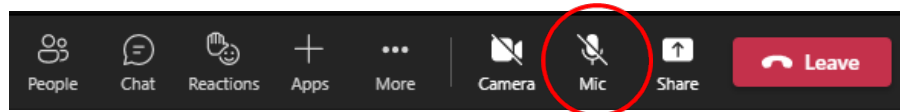

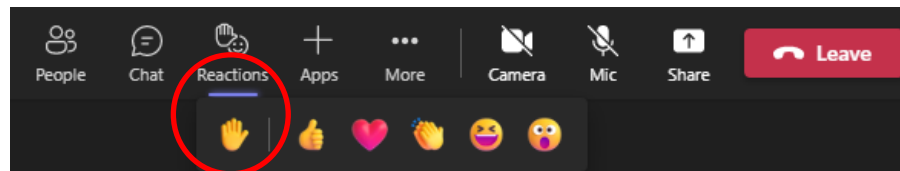

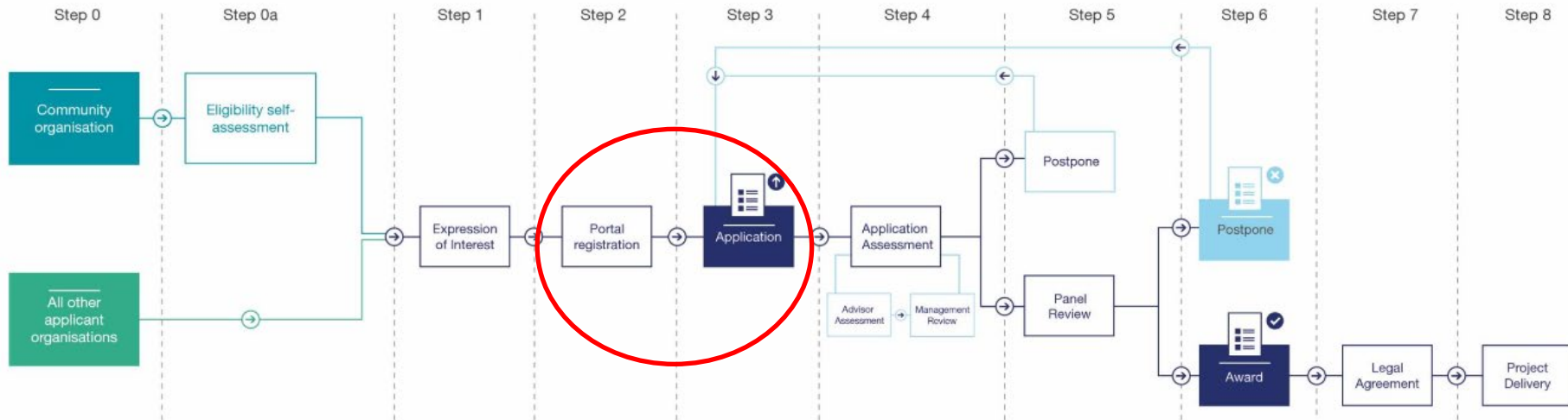


Introduction to Places for Everyone

RIBA Stages and groupings



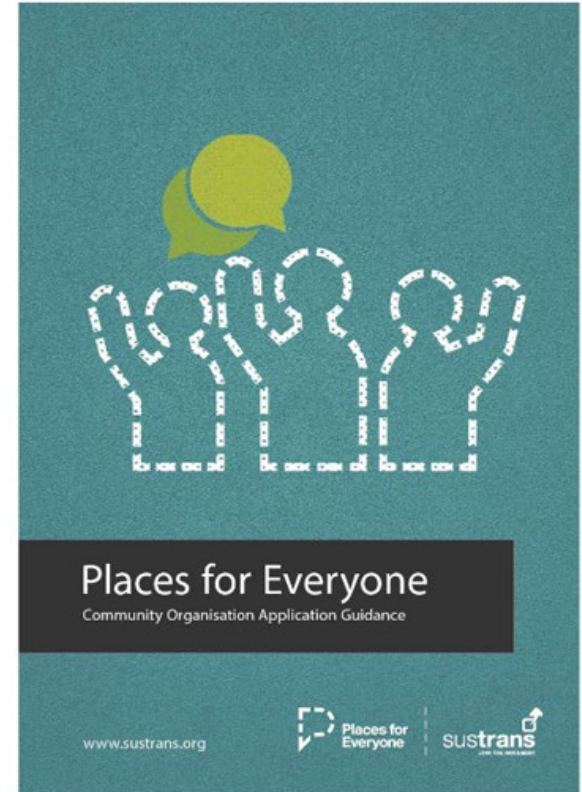
Assessment and Scoring

- First an assessment is carried out by a **Grant Advisor** who will review any deliverables submitted to assess progress.
- Scoring will then be undertaken by a **Grant Advisor** and a **Capital Advisor** based on **Impact, Cost, and Deliverability**
- **Managers** collectively review assessment scores and recommendations presented to them by the **Grant Advisor**
- A further recommendation is presented to a **Panel** of Senior Sustrans Leaders
- **Funding decisions** will be communicated as **awarded with conditions** or **as not awarded with feedback**.

How to make a good application

- Use **SMART objectives** – Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, Time-bound
- Demonstrate a willingness to aim for **high quality**
 - Refer to: Design principles and Quality standards (*Applicant guidance – Concept, pgs. 6-7*)
- Show **how** you intend to deliver your plans, including **programme and cost**
- Be **realistic and transparent** about **deliverability** - possible hurdles or lack of specialist knowledge
- Be **specific** about the **impact** of *your* project
- **Fully answer** the questions – you shouldn't have any blanks

What to expect during a project

- You are supported by an assigned **Grant Advisor** - their role is to **monitor, steer, and advise** on the aims of Places for Everyone
- Projects can take anywhere from **2 to 10+ years** depending on their complexity and issues that arise
- Places for Everyone funding covers the costs of suitable consultant support, and development officer time (if your organisation employs one), as well as project-related fees such as planning fees
- You will need to **collaborate** with stakeholders, the community, the local authority, professional consultants, and Sustrans
- We will review the **project support needs** after Stage 0: Strategic definition
- You will be offered **relevant training in CDM 2015**

- Final Outcome: Announced by 21 November 2022
